Chocolate Chip Oat Bars

Nonstick Cooking Spray

1 stick butter, softened

¾ cup light brown sugar

2 eggs

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

1 cup whole wheat pastry flour (I found this at WinCo, so it is available)

½ teaspoon baking powder

¼ teaspoon salt

¼ cup milk

1 ½ cup rolled oats

1 cup semisweet chocolate chips

½ cup chopped pecans

Fall Business Meeting

The Fall Business Meeting was held on Nov 1st. The National Conference was discussed along with the results of the recent outreach survey.

Section business that was addressed included:

- Alice will update the WSU-TC Bulletin Board, with information provided by Dimple.
- Methods to promote the sale of Certificates of Merit (our fundraising activity) were discussed and it was determined that Dimple and Alicia will create a flyer to solicit orders from other sections nationwide.
- The Certificate of Merit awards program was also discussed. In order to increase participation, Jennifer and Michelle will contact local schools that have not responded in the past or that are not currently on the list.

Preheat oven to 350. Grease a 9-inch baking pan with cooking spray and set aside.

Put butter and sugar into a large bowl and mash together with a fork until well combined. Add eggs and vanilla and stir well. In a separate medium bowl, mix together flour, baking powder, and salt. Add flour mixture to sugar mixture in thirds, alternating with the milk. Stir in oats, chocolate chips and pecans until combined then transfer batter to prepared pan, smooth out evenly and bake until golden brown around the edges and a toothpick inserted in the middle comes out clean, about 30 minutes. Set aside to cool then cut into squares and serve.

The Western Regions Joint Conference will be co-hosted by the SWE University of Hawaii at Manoa collegiate section and the SWE-Hawaiian Islands "Proposed" professional section at the Sheraton Waikiki in Honolulu.

The Western Regions (Regions A, B, and J) consist of Alaska, Washington, Oregon, Montana, Idaho, California, Nevada, Hawaii, Arizona, New Mexico, and Utah. This is a great opportunity to network with SWE members in beautiful Hawaii. After a 2-year charter process, the SWE-Hawaiian Islands Professional Section will celebrate its inaugural event during the Friday night luau!

The conference theme is "Ride the Wave of Innovation" and the conference committee has planned many technical tours, family-friendly activities, and conference workshops that showcase Hawaii as a model for innovation.

Technical Tours include The Kahe "full flex" Power Plant, H-Power Plant in Campbell Industrial Park, Waihee Tunnel, Interstate H-3, Kahuku Wind turbines, Haleakala Observatory, and Pearl Harbor Naval Shipyard. The conference has also organized family fun tours, such as The Polynesian Cultural Center, Hanauma Bay, Sacred Spirits Cultural Daytime Tour and Orbs of Oahu Driving Tour, Honolulu City Haunts, Makiki/Tantalus Bike Tour, and a WWII Heroes Tour. **Tour registration closes December 2nd, so don't delay!**

Registration is now open and can be completed online at www.swewestern2012.org. **The early bird registration deadline is December 1st**, and regular registration ends February 24th.

Alaska Airlines and American Airlines are offering discounts to conference attendees. Alaska discount is 7% and American discount is 5%, promotional codes available on the conference travel website <http://www.swewestern2012.org/airfare.php>.

The Sheraton Waikiki has SWE group rooms for Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, and Saturday nights. The negotiated room rate is \$250 per day for up to 4 people.

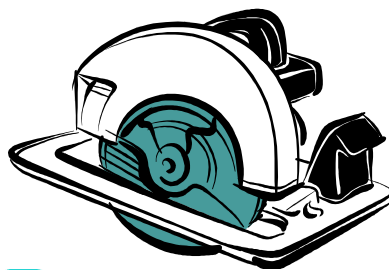
The event included a presentation that answered the questions:
